I was in English class.

It was uneasy and not as carefree as it was prior. Also I was working at Swanky Frank's in Westport at the time and remember it affecting business tremendously.

Before 9/11 what have you learned about terrorism in school?

School never really mentioned much about terrorism. I knew very general about it but it wasn't a topic discussed much.

Once the information started to get passed around, the principal ordered the computers to be taken offline and the TV's to be shut down... Do you think that was a good idea?

Yes and no. It's important to be aware of what's going on in the world but I think the principal was doing it in order to protect the students.

Did you have a cell phone to communicate?

Yes, I did have a cell phone to reach out to my parents and siblings.

How do you think you, and kids in your grade were affected emotionally that day, and later on that year?

Kids that had relatives and/or knew someone that worked in the trade towers were very emotional and unable to really know if they were ok or not.
